Earthworms



- There are no native earthworms in MN.
- Human interference is the main method of transportation by dumping bait or moving worms and/or eggs by foot or vehicle.
- Earthworms eat the leaf litter that is habitat for wildflowers, tree seedlings, and a diverse range of wildlife.
- In addition, earthworm infestation can increase erosion and nutrient leaching.
- Dump bait in the trash and check shoes and tires for worms and eggs will help to further prevent the spread
